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## Justification and objectives (I)

- Division of governance powers -constitutional and legal- of the Judiciary and the administration of justice between the various institutional actors and powers.
- Different roles and capacities of the various institutions/powers in the region.
- Models of interaction and judicial independence.
- Analysis of the setting up of the legislative agendas of the EU and EU MS Ministries of Justice in relation to the contents of judicial policies and administration of Justice.



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## Justification and objectives (II)

- Legislative strategies and legislative agendas. Strategic planning.
- Comparative overview in the region on the degree of development in the ENPI South Partner countries, comprehensive legislation. Similarities and differences.
- Convergences and divergences from the “European standard” and the standard in place in the different countries of the region.
- Identify specific needs



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## Main topics suggested for discussion (I)

Governance and competencies of the judiciary: Which are the current international models and trends regarding distribution of governance/competencies between the Judiciary and the justice administration?

What are the more relevant constitutional trends with respect to the distribution of governance competences between the Judiciary and the justice administration?

The ENPI SPC scenario: the new Moroccan experience, the new Tunisian Constitution, the Judicial Authority in the new Egyptian Constitution, the Algerian experience, the Jordanian model, the Israeli model, the Lebanese model and the Palestinian model regarding the distribution of governance competences between the Judiciary and the justice administration.

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## Main topics suggested for discussion (II)

The European scenario: opinion number 10 of the Consultative Council of European Judges (CCEJ) and other relevant documents

The EU scenario: recommendations of the European Network of Councils for the Judiciary (ENCJ). A critical review of the present and future evolution in the EU MS regarding the EU models of distribution of competences between the Council of the Judiciary, the Ministry of Justice and other actors of the judicial policy.

Overview of legislative programmes in the EU MS concerning the Judiciary and the justice administration : A common or standard programme?

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## Target Group

We propose to implement this activity as a three-day training seminar addressed to policy makers in the Ministry of Justice or equivalent, representatives of the Councils for the Judiciary/Supreme Court, the Prosecution Office and Bars Societies or highly specialised NGOs from the beneficiary countries, or judges and prosecutors involved in such procedures.

We expect participation of up to four representatives from each of the beneficiary countries.
